Dear Parents/Guardians,

This is a joint letter from the Principals of ACS (Barker Road) and ACS (Primary) concerning road safety issues and the movement of vehicles in the school vicinity.

A. Road Safety and Courtesy on the road

1. We would like to stress the importance of road safety for our students, and would like to remind all Parents/Guardians to observe the traffic rules when they are driving around our school vicinity, including Barker Road and Chancery Lane Student Activity Area.
2. As vehicular traffic is especially heavy during the morning and school dismissal hours as well as at dismissal after Co-Curricular Activities (CCA) and Supplementary/Remedial Lessons, we would like to appeal for your support and patience to observe the following:
 - (a) Do reduce your car speed before and upon entering Barker Road.
 - (b) **Please give way to students** who are using the pedestrian crossing outside Chancery Lane Student Activity Area leading to school Gate B (clock tower), as it could pose a danger to students if cars do not give way to them.
 - (c) All vehicles waiting to enter the Barker Road Campus Transport Centre are required to queue along the left-most lane of Barker Road (after Caltex Station) if you wish to enter into the school. Please do not obstruct the right lane as other vehicles will need to access Barker Road or drive up to Gate C/B3 for drop-off and pick-up.
 - (d) For drop-off or pick-up of students, do ensure that the student alight or board the car in a timely manner so as not to hold up other waiting vehicles.
 - (e) For drop-off of students, it will be helpful to remind the students to place their belongings in the car (not the car boot). This will prevent further delay or slowing down of traffic flow when students alight from the car to retrieve their belonging from the car boot.
 - (f) Do refrain from parking along Barker Road as it will cause unnecessary traffic congestion. Illegal parking will be subjected to Traffic Police summon.

B. Use of Chancery Lane Student Activity Area (Student Activity Area)

1. Singapore Land Authority (SLA) has given the school a Temporary Occupation Licence (TOL) to use the area at the Chancery Lane as a Student Activity Area. Except for school-related activities, the school has been strictly warned by SLA that it should not be used as a carpark. The Student Activity Area at Chancery Lane is currently used by our students for various outdoor activities. The school has designated it as a pick-up and drop-off point to ease the traffic situation at Dunearn Road only during peak hours. **Failure to comply with SLA's regulations may see the TOL revoked.** We seek your understanding and support in adhering to SLA's direction and refrain from parking your vehicle in the area at all times.

2. To ease the flow of traffic at Chancery Lane, during the peak morning drop-off and afternoon dismissal hours, Land Transport Authority (LTA) has implemented a **"No right-turn"** rule onto Chancery Lane when cars exit the Chancery Lane Activity Area. When all cars turn left onto Chancery Lane, it would certainly lead to a smoother flow for cars turning into and out of the Student Activity Area. **Do take note that actions will be taken by Traffic Police against errant drivers who do not follow this ruling.** The timing for the "Norange-turn" rule is from 6.45am to 7.45am and from 1.30pm to 3pm as shown below:



3. We would like to highlight that the entrance and exit of the Student Activity Area has been widened to facilitate the entry and exit of vehicles. We have since observed an improvement in the traffic flow as it allows two cars to enter and exit at the same time easily.
4. Parents/Guardians may wish to consider this as an alternative route for drop-off/ pick-up of students. Appended below is a picture to show the entry and exit of the area:



C. Safety in Disembarkation from Vehicles at Gate C and B3

1. We have noticed that some students have been dropped-off and picked-up in the mornings/afternoons in an unsafe manner, especially at Gate C and B3. Do take note of the following:
 - (a) Please drop-off/ pick-up the students on the right lane, by the side of the road (where the pavement is safe for the students to walk into the school).
 - (b) Please do not drop-off or pick-up on the left lane as there will be oncoming vehicles.



2. The school has also received feedback from parents/guardians and Barker Road residents on our students being dropped off at the self-created second lane and caused a jam at Barker Road. **Please note that the police and LTA have been informed and actions will be taken against errant drivers.**

D. Parking Arrangements at the Transport Centre

1. As announced in March 2018, all public officers who park in school are required to pay for parking from August 2018 onwards. Season parking charges have been imposed, in line with the Public Service Division's "clean wage" policy, which stipulates that salaries are fully accounted for, with no hidden perks and privileges. This also applies to non-public officers who require a car park lot whose work place is within the school premises (e.g. the canteen vendors, contract workers).
2. The demarcated red parking lots within Transport are reserved for campus staff with season parking decals. The season parking hours are from Monday to Friday, 5.00 a.m. to 6.00 p.m. Vehicles without the season parking decal may be wheel clamped by our security staff. A fee of \$100.00 will be charged to release your car.
3. Please apply for a car park label for access to Transport Centre and/or Chancery Lane Student Activity Area. The car park label for parents/guardians allows you access to the two areas but it does not entitle you to a parking lot. Other designated drop-off/pick-up points include the Chancery Lane Student Activity Area and Gates C/B3 along Barker Road. We seek your understanding in this matter so that staff can park easily in the morning when they need to be in school quickly to take care of school matters. Parents/Guardians are also advised to refrain from parking your vehicles outside the school gate or bus bay in such a way that it obstructs the flow of traffic. Such indiscriminate parking is a danger to other drivers as well as pedestrians.
4. The school requests that all parent/guardian cooperate with us on the following:
 - (a) Refrain from double parking or create a second lane in the transport centre for pick-up or drop-off as it will compromise our students' safety. The same applies if you need to wait for your son/ward. You are required to drive around the centre until he arrives.
 - (b) Our security staff will only allow cars to enter the campus at arrival and dismissal times of the kindergarten, primary and secondary schools. We seek your co-operation with

- the security guards as they will provide you with the necessary directions.
- (c) Refrain from parking your vehicles outside the school gate or bus bay in such a way that it obstructs the flow of traffic. Such indiscriminate parking is a danger to other drivers as well as pedestrians.

E. Parking along Goldhill Avenue, Dunearn Road and Chancery Lane

1. Residents around the school campus and the general public have also provided feedback that drivers who illegally parked on the public roads while waiting for our students, in the morning and dismissal times, have caused serious traffic congestion.
2. Please be cautioned that the Traffic Police is aware of the illegal parking situation along the public roads and is keeping a close watch. The Traffic Police is stepping up their patrol for illegal parking near the school.
3. It has been observed that many cars are parked along Chancery Lane before the entrance of the Student Activity Area up to the traffic lights junction. This poses a danger to other car drivers as well as pedestrians and is in clear violation of the Road Traffic Act.
4. The Traffic Police and the LTA have also recently announced more stringent measures to enforce traffic regulations, for the safety of everyone.

We appreciate your cooperation in these traffic matters as our students' safety is of utmost concern to us and we will not hesitate to stop any inconsiderate drivers from entering our school premises.
